Now in its seventh edition, *Norway Now: Performing Arts* from the Northern Latitudes serves as one of the most important opportunities for North American presenters to discover a wide range of independent Norwegian artists creating rigorous new works in dance, physical theater, puppetry, video, multi-disciplinary and performance art. Held annually in New York City at the renowned Scandinavia House, seventeen artists and their producers give a 5-minute pitch highlighting one work that is in development or ready to tour. This is followed by networking opportunities for international collaboration, co-production and presenting.

The extraordinary breadth of work presented each year is a result of Norway's ongoing commitment to providing social and financial resources that enable performing artists to research, innovate, develop and disseminate their work within a dynamic framework of government agencies and cultural institutions, as well as individual and private efforts.

Over the past seven years Norway Now's efforts have been highly successful — helping to bring North American presenters to Norway to see work and meet artists, as well as touring Norwegian companies throughout North America. The number of artists coming to the US has increased exponentially. 

THE BREAKDOWN suggests that The Butterfly Effect can be imposed on genetics, cultural history, the mere chaos of human will, and the sudden impact of meteors.

THE BREAKDOWN is a Carl Saganesque chain of thoughts, partly scientific and partly imaginative, reminding us about the importance of being humble towards our short-lived existence. We are not unique, we are the sum total of everything.



The work is inspired by 71 personal experiences and testimonies from transgender individuals in Europe. From a human level, this artistic project gives visibility, awakes curiosity and generates knowledge about the transgender community.

By exposing diverse ways of being, the project proposes new references and ways of appreciating beauty and producing desire. What is gender? What does it mean to be transgender? What is the difference between a transgender person and a cisgender person? What differences are there between gender identity, gender expression, biological sex, and sexual orientation?

Daniel Mariblanca is a professional dancer with an education from Toulouse CDC (Center for Youth Education Choreographers), France. He graduated in Contemporary Dance at the Institute del Teatre de Barcelona in 2005. Ludvig DaaeDance To Dance To

Project Description

With Dance To Dance To Ludvig Daae challenges some of the conventions and compositional tools he has been taught and which are often found in staged dance. By replacing ballet with 1970's disco dance through the history of dance he questions the terms "innovation" and "high culture". With the help of three dancers, Daae remakes the fictional choreographer Esmeralda Vasquez's classic disco dance piece from 1783.

By sticking to this strict premise and focusing on 1970's disco, his personal ideas concerning dramaturgy, virtuosity, use of the room, development, contrast, and relations on stage as well as to the audience are thrown out the window. Dance To Dance To questions why we give more value to certain types of aesthetics, but above all, this work is a dance piece about experiencing dancing.

Company Bio

Ludvig Daae is a Norwegian choreographer, educated at the Royal Swedish Ballet School in Stockholm and P.A.R.T.S. in Brussels. His works are always colored by his interest in entertainment and popular culture, but his main focus is dance and movement. He choreographed the piece Donna Winter for Cullbergbaletten's appearance at the Nobel Banquet in Stockholm City Hall and is currently touring his latest piece Dance To Dance To. He is creating a new piece The Viral Dance, which is part of a long term project Daae/ Nordahl—a collaboration between himself and film maker Joanna Nordahl.

Ingri FiksdalDeep Field

Project Description

Ingri Fiksdal's new piece "Deep Field" centers around running and its affective qualities, for both performers and the audience. Amongst runners, the much sought-after "runners' high" denotes the affective state of euphoria where endorphins are released into the body, acting in a similar way to their medically engineered counterpart, morphine. They serve as a painkiller, and have through evolution helped human survival through providing extra stamina, for instance when hunting animals. Endorphins are produced in the pre-frontal and limbic regions of the brain, which also light up in response to emotions, like love. In "Deep Field" Fiksdal investigates how to produce this love-like euphoria amongst the running performers, and to what degree it can be contagious for the audience. The work is based on ideas of kinesthetic transference; that one body can experience the movement of another empathically through watching, feeling and hearing its presence in space. The music is composed by Jenny Hval and Lasse Marhaug.

Company Bio

Ingri Fiksdal is a Norwegian choreographer. She just finished a PhD in artistic research at the Oslo National Academy of the Arts, with the project "Affective Choreographies", which included the production of six performances as well as three publications. Fiksdal's productions tour to various festivals and venues in Europe, Asia and North America: "Night Tripper" to CAC Cincinnati and TBA Portland, and "Cosmic Body" to MCA Chicago. Upcoming NA-touring includes "Diorama" and "STATE", which will both be performed at MCA Chicago and CAC Cincinnati in February 2019, as well as presentations of "Diorama" at The Harbourfront Centre in May 2019, and at Fusebox Festival and The Chocolate Factory in 2020.



Project Description

I ask my granddad what sound he remembers best from the war. He answers "The hatch that was battened down above us when the torpedo alarm sounded." Granddad recounts how at the age of eleven he was taken from his home and forcibly evacuated on the German ship Karl Arp. Why hadn't I heard about this before? Why hadn't I asked? The contemporary dance performance FORGOTTEN digs into the collective and individual memory of World War 2, in which Northern Norway and its inhabitants were hit particularly hard.

Through authentic sound recordings, objects and movements the performance seeks to explore the mysterious nature of memory, trauma, survival and hope. To lose, to forget, to repress and recall. And to try to rise again.

In 2018 FORGOTTEN was selected for Tanzmesse nrw, Düsseldorf, Germany and the official program at CINARS. Montreal. Canada.

Simone Grøtte is a contemporary dance choreographer from Lakselv in Northern Norway. Her work is strongly influenced by her indigenous Sami background and living and working in the arctic region, where these elements are woven into a modern expression in the themes, scenography and music. Her projects explore questions revolving around identity and belonging, with an approach focusing on human emotions and perspectives. Grøtte has collaborated on productions with large institutions such as The Arctic Theatre, Varangerfestivalen and The Arctic Arts Festival where she recently created the critically acclaimed and popular performance FORGOTTEN. In 2019/2020 she is commissioned for work with Norrdans in Sweden and The Arctic Theatre in Tromsø, Norway.



A List of Things He Said



Project Description

A List of Things He Said explores masculine fragility in an ambiguous game between four performers, with Ingun Bjørnsgaard's unique choreographic take on formal detail and everyday pathos. In a vaguely staged public space, the distinguished dancers come together in attempts at duets and coherent group sequences, interrupted by the individuality of solos. The possibility of existential freedom is at stake, but also the co-dependency of the self-conscious male. The performance lingers on situations that occur between the performers, and quietly insists on the presence of the yet unknown, to explore vulnerability and strength in the male interactions. Finnish composer Einojuhani Rautavaara's virtuous piano music performed live, and contemporary music by Christian Wallumrød, interacts with the choreography in refined sensitivity. The result is a quivering space of emergent meaning and poetry. A List of Things He Said premiered on October 19th at Dansens Hus, Oslo, Norway, in a double-bill with Notes on Frailty, and ventures further into the company's examination of gender and contemporary identity.

Company Bio

Ingun Bjørnsgaard Prosjekt was founded in Oslo in 1992 by Ingun Bjørnsgaard, a choreographer whose work continues to influence the Nordic dance scene. Through her own company, she has been able to rigorously follow her artistic vision together with a preeminent ensemble of dancers who sensitively engage in the creation of movement and dramaturgy. A profound artistic research into the relationship between movement and music from the classical and baroque eras, as well as new music composed for the performances, is characteristic of Bjørnsgaard's work. Writing movement in time and space, her choreographic work has been awarded with a number of prestigious prizes. Ingun Bjørnsgaard is commissioned to work with prominent companies such as the Norwegian National Ballet, Carte Blanche, CCN - Ballet de Lorraine, Tanztheater Bremen, Komische Oper, Berlin, and GöteborgsOperans Danskompani.

Tori Wrånes created NAAM YAAI (Big Water) for the first edition of Thailand Biennale in Krabi (2018). The performance is a collaboration with thai traditional musicians Anirut Kuwalairat, Kunlawat Loedbanchong and Santisuk Anantasiri.

In a small island surrounded by water, live furry creatures sitting on rocks as if they were born out of the dripping tears of the mountain. They live and move in a slow and subtle way, following the tide, moving between high and low water trying to survive monsoon. Unless you come in a kayak or swim, it can be difficult to discover them as they blend into the rocky landscape and seldom come out of their caves. The creatures have their own language and rituals. In this period of the year, big water season, they come out and gather to celebrate nature. Amongst the sound of waves and winds you may hear the gripping melody of their flutes and their mystical singing.

Tori Wranes is a vocalist and artist, and has a trans medial artistic practice, which unfolds as performance, sculptures, videos or installations. Sounds, musical instruments. costumes, props, architecture and sculptures deforms her appearance and creates new rituals and dreamlike constellations. Choreography with sound might be a good way to describe her work. HANNAH

Project Description

In their new production HANNAH, Verdensteatret is exploring ideas about geological time and attention fatigue used as an observatory. As a starting point Verdensteatret went on a research journey to the Mekong Delta in Vietnam in November 2016, the same destination as they had 10 years ago. With this research the artist collective has, for the first time, chosen to repeat a journey and gather material from somewhere they have already been. HANNAH is an elaborate spatial composition that provokes a state of absorption in an immersive audio-visual space. Inspired by the immense span and gradual unfolding of geological time, the material acts as a kind of sedimentation process, drawing attention to gentle transformations and how physical objects slowly affect their surroundings. From a human perspective the material unfolds from fixed attention towards exhaustion - in the act of observing slow changes. A production from Verdensteatret is a glimpse of the present, a state of transitions and passages through phenomenons. The present is a memory in motion. At the same time, there has never been so much past as right now.

VERDENSTEATRET is an artist collective based in Oslo. The group's continuous artistry has been established over the last 30 years. The group was founded in Bergen in 1986 by Lisbeth J. 



The Surprised Body makes you think of clouds of light floating across the sky. Already as a title, it defines a metaphorical space: the image of a body in constant alert. The sense of "surprise" is intended as the inner state that allows one to be constantly ready to "react" and respond, as an individual and as a group. The project focuses on choreographic composition and structured improvisations that see the body and an effortless quality of movement, as its central element. It often generates in the audience a subtle and fascinating effect: a contagious need to dance. The Surprised Body has been developing, as an ongoing creative process, by creating several versions of the work with different constellation of dancers. sometimes also involving new composers and musicians. The process enriches itself, through the experience of its happening: with each version, by sharing knowledge with participants, it acquires new knowledge. Since its première in Buenos Aires in October 2010, it has been successfully presented in 27 countries in Europe, Asia and South America.


